GRAND CANYON LANDS WITHDRAWN FROM NEW CLAIMS.

Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar announced his decision to protect more than 1 million acres of federal lands surrounding the Grand Canyon and its vital watershed from additional uranium and other hardrock mining for the next 20 years. The Public Land Order to withdraw this acreage for 20 years from new mining claims and sites under the 1872 Mining Law is authorized by the Federal Land Policy and Management Act. The withdrawn area includes 355,874 acres of U.S. Forest Service land on the Kaibab National Forest: 626,678 acres of Bureau of Land Management lands; and 23,993 acres of split estate—where surface lands are held by other owners while subsurface minerals are owned by the federal government. MONDAVI ESTATE SELLS IN SEALED-BID

AUCTION. The 56-acre Napa Valley estate of iconic vintner Robert Mondavi sold to an undisclosed international buyer in late 2011. Although the purchase price was not revealed, the minimum reserve was \$13.9 million, a 44%

discount off the original listing price of \$25 million. The property includes an 11,500-square-foot main residence designed by Cliff May, the Father of the California Ranch House. Sheldon Good & Co. handled the transaction. Video and photos of the estate are available **HERE**.

HISTORIC HORSE RANCH CLOSES.

Central Montana's Horse Ranch sold in December 2011. The 22,812-acre ranch had been listed at \$15 million; financial terms of the sale were not disclosed. According to listing broker Mike Swan of **Bates Sanders Swan Land**

Company, the Horse Ranch is "a rare combination of privacy, beauty, and scale in a contiguous block of deeded acreage that is very difficult to find in today's western land market." **Ryan Flair of Fay Ranches** represented the buyer.







Texas Water Rights

LUBBOCK AND AMARILLO ACQUIRE MESA WATER RIGHTS. The Canadian River Municipal Water Authority (CRMWA) closed on the \$103 million purchase of Mesa Water holdings in the Texas Panhandle. CRMWA supplies water to 11 member cities via a 358-

mile aqueduct system. The December signing came after last summer's preliminary agreement between CRMWA and Mesa Water, which outlined the purchase of 211,217 surface acres of water rights owned by T. Boone Pickens and Mesa Water. "Once the area lost Lake Meredith, it became clear that's where the water needed to stay," Pickens told *The Land Report*.
