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EW N^{O.} 1. Sierra Pacific Industries (SPI) has completed its acquisition of Oregon-based Seneca Jones Timber Company and Seneca Sawmills. The transaction, which was announced on August 6, closed October 1. The 175,000-acre acquisition brings the Emmerson family's timberland holdings to 2.3 million acres, eclipsing the 2.2 million acres owned by John Malone. "Aaron Jones and Red Emmerson are both icons of the wood products industry. They were also friends and had a deep mutual respect for each other as industry leaders," said Seneca CEO Todd Payne in a statement released in August.

"This is a meaningful day for Sierra Pacific Industries as well as for Seneca," said SPI President George Emmerson in a statement announcing the completion of the sale. "The combined company brings together an outstanding team of people that will leverage our shared expertise in sustainable forest management and innovation in manufacturing, working together to provide quality lumber and wood products to the marketplace. We are excited to be joining the Oregon forest products industry, along with the opportunities for further growth in the state," Emmerson said. Read more HERE.

BEACHFRONT PROPERTY SEIZED FROM BLACK OWNERS TO BE RETURNED.

Manhattan Beach used eminent domain to take control of a strip of beachfront property owned by black citizens, citing complaints from white residents. Subsequently owned by Los Angeles County, the beach was opened to the public with laws in place that prohibited the county from ever disposing of it. Gov. Gavin Newsom signed a bill to reverse that, paving the way for the land transfer back to the descendents of Charles and Willa Bruce, who first purchased the property in 1912 for \$1,225. Amid threats from the Ku Klux Klan, the couple developed Bruce's Beach, which included a lodge, cafe, dance hall, and dressing tents. In today's market, the land could fetch upwards of \$75 million. According to a 2021 farm real estate survey conducted by the South Dakota State University Ness School of Management and Economics, the price of the state's non-irrigated farmland rose nearly 5 percent in a year to \$3,814 per acre compared to \$3,638 in 2020. Meanwhile the statewide average gross rates of return (rent-to-value ratio) increased 2.5 percent for pasture/rangeland while jumping 3.2 percent percent for non-irrigated cropland; this ratio typically tracks with interest rates. In addition, the statewide average cash rental rates increased \$5 for cropland and \$4 for pasture/rangeland as compared to one year ago. Read more HERE.



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

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






South Carolina Timberland GREENTREES AND MILLIKEN FORESTRY TO LAUNCH CARBON SEQUESTRATION PROJECT. Known as GreenTrees South Carolina, the undertaking is an offshoot of the largest voluntary forest

carbon project in the world, which provides access to carbon markets that were previously inaccessible to small and mediumsize landowners. GreenTrees works with owners to plan, plant, and calculate the carbon sequestration from the trees growing on their land, data that is then independently verified and added to the carbon market. To date, GreenTrees and some 600 landowner partners have planted 50 million trees in 13 states on more than 120,000 acres of land. By 2030, the goal is 100 million trees, which will result in 35.1 metric tons of CO_2 sequestered. Milliken Forestry has a longstanding presence in South Carolina.
