PANELISTS TO SEARCH FOR NEW MODEL OF CONSERVATION FUNDING. The Association

of Fish & Wildlife Agencies (AFWA) has named 20 leaders from the outdoor recreation, retail and manufacturing sectors, the energy industry, and sportsmen's groups to its Blue **Ribbon Panel on Sustaining** America's Diverse Fish and Wildlife Resources. Under the leadership of co-chairs Johnny Morris, founder and CEO of Bass Pro Shops, and Dave Freudenthal, former Wyoming governor, the panel will spend a year drafting policy options on sustained funding for fish and wildlife diversity. Currently state hunting and fishing license dollars, along with federal taxes on boat fuel, and hunting and fishing gear, helps fund conservation programs. Offshore Wind Farms

WIND-TURBINE PROJECTS ADVANCE

CLOSER TO REALITY. America's first offshore wind farm, the planned Cape Wind, now has a coastal Atlantic staging area big enough to handle construction of 130 massive turbines.

Cape Wind Associates has signed a two-year \$4.5M lease with the State of Massachusetts for a terminal in New Bedford harbor. Starting in January, Cape Wind will use the harbor site to assemble materials that will then be ferried 30 miles to the 24-square-mile farm site in Nantucket Sound. Also, this May the U.S. Department of Energy awarded money to three offshore wind farm demonstration projects planned for New Jersey, Oregon and Virginia. 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
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Historic Colorado Ranch



A *Steamboat Today* reporter lists the buyer as the Tamara Diane Miller Revocable Trust, an account set up for Disney's granddaughter. Real estate broker Brian Smith, of Hall and Hall real estate, represented Wood. All parties were asked not to comment on the sale. The property sold below its asking price of \$12.95 million. Penny Fletcher, a broker who also sits on the Steamboat Springs Board of Realtors, said the deal is still significant. "We haven't had a sale go down like this in a long time," Fletcher said. 
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
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New York Timberland

\$22.5M. This 28,120-acre± preserve on New York's Saint Regis River is surrounded by high peaks. Vincent McClelland of LandVest has the listing in coordination with Fay Ranches.

Originally part of William Rockefeller's Bay Pond Estate, this preserve is now called Brandon. It was acquired by the Ross family in 1939 and includes one of the first conservation easements granted to The Nature Conservancy.
